Ceolchoirm Cheatharlach ar son na Somáile

IS in olcas atá an gorta agus an triomach ag dul sa tSomáil agus tugann na Náisiúin Aontaithe le fios go leathfaidh an gorta níos measa fós muna gcuirfear cabhair éigeandála ar fáil gan mhoill. De bharr an triomaigh is measa le seasca bliain ag Corn na hAfraice tá ganntanas mór millteach de bhia sa tír. Ón uair gur fógraíodh an gorta an samhradh seo fuair na mílte míle duine bás de bharr easpa bia agus tá na páistí ag fulaingt go trom mar gheall ar dhrochchothú. Is trua mhéileach na radharcanna atáimid ag fáil ar uafáis na Somáile ó lár an tsamhraidh nuair a thug Mary Robinson, Iar-Uachtarán na hÉireann, cuairt ar an tír. Ba léir an fhírinne i súile na leanaí agus ar aghaidh an iar-uachtaráin. Bhí an-ímní uirthi faoin méid a chonaic sí. Tharraing sí aird an phobail ar an tír sin i 1992 nuair a thug sí cuairt ar an Somáil agus í ina huachtarán. Beagnach scór bliain ar aghaidh agus is in olcas atá cúrsaí imithe.

Creidtear go bhfuil tionchar ag an ngorta áirithe seo ar 13 milliún duine agus is gasúir iad leath daoibh. Tá na mílte teifeac ón tSomáil ag éalú ón ngorta uafásach go campaí dídeanaithe, campaí atá plódaithe cheana féin. Tuairiscítear go bhfuil breis is 1,000 duine ag bogadh ón tSomáil chun na Aetóipe agus na Céinia in aghaidh an lae. Dar le hurlabhraí Trócaire tá scéalta uafásacha cloister acu ó na daoine atá ag sroichint na gcampaí, scéalta faoi pháistí agus faoi sheandaoine ag

fáil bháis ar an mbealach go dtí na campaí toisc iad a bheith ró-lag chun siúl níos mó. Ní raibh a dóthain báistí in oirthear an hAfraice le breis is bliain agus tá na milliúin ag braith ar chabhair bhia.

Tá na milliún euro ag teastail ó na Náisiúin Aontaithe chun iarracht a dhéanamh dul í ngleic leis an ngorta agus tá na heagraíochtaí cabhrach ar nós Trócaire, Concern agus Oxfam ag impí ar an gcomhphobal idirnáisiúnta cúnaimh a chur ar fáil go prainneach de bharr na géirchéime daonna. Fiú agus fadhanna airgid ag chuire dhuine i laethanta seo na géirchéime eacnamaíochta, níl teorainn le flaitiúlacht na nÉireannach. Thar thréimhse cúpla mí thug muintir na tíre seo €12 milliún chun cabhrú leo siúd atá ag fulaingt go dona sa tSomáil. Is léir go bhfuil an-suim ag na Gaeil sa scéal seo. Seans go n-aithnímid go rabhmar féin, a bheag nó a mhór, sa chás céanna céad go leith bliain ó shin. Beidh deis ag muintir Cheatharlach cabhrú le muintir na Somáile an tseachtain seo trí thacaíocht a thabhairt do cheolchoirm dar teideal Carlow Aid for Somalia a reachtálfar in amharclann G.B. Shaw mar chuid d'imeachtaí Fhéile an Fhómhair. Cuirfear ceolchoirm den scoth i láthair ar an Déardaoin, 13 Deireadh Fómhair. Beidh rogha agus togha amhránaíthe, ceoltóirí agus rincooirí ar an stáitse agus rachaidh fáiltais uile na hoíche chun cabhrú leo siúd atá i gcrúachas sa tSomáil. Is é €10 an táille agus tá Glór Cheatharlach ag impí ar dhaoine ticéid a cheannach le cinntiú go mbeidh an amharclann lán agus lear maith airgid ag deireadh na hoíche. Is féidir ticéid a chur in áirithe ach dul i dteagmháil leis an amharclann ar 059 9172400. Beidh ionadaí thar cheann Trócaire i láthair ar an oíche chomh maith.
